CONDITIONS

Conditions

1. The Deans are the last ones to sign the guest pass and **they must receive it no later than three days** prior to the dance or event.
2. The guest may not enter the CCHS event without a current ID or present Student ID.
3. CCHS Students may invite one guest, and they must not be over twenty years of age.
3. The guest must abide by all CCHS guidelines regarding behavior as outlined in the CCHS Parent/Student Handbook. The guest is to follow all CCHS Dress Code policies while attending a CCHS event.
4. By inviting this guest, host student promises to be responsible for the actions/ behaviors of their guest.
5. This pass is issued by the Director of Student Activities and can be revoked at any time.

OTHER RULES/SUGGESTIONS

1. CCHS dress code will be enforced and students not dressed appropriately (excessive cleavage, slits, dresses with low backs, below the best line midriffs) will be denied entrance.
2. No inappropriate dancing (students will be asked to stop and then leave if inappropriate behavior continues)
3. Dance Policy: the following rules and regulations are applicable to all school dances:
 - a. Freak Dancing will not be allowed nor is it an acceptable style of dancing. The definition of Freak Dancing is any or all dancing that is found to be “sexually suggestive in any way.” Examples of this are, but not limited to:
 - i. Any inappropriate backside dancing (ankle/knee grabbing, bending over more than 90 degrees, etc.)
 - ii. Inappropriate touching, fondling, excessive displays of affection.
 - iii. Removal of shirts, pants or necessary articles of clothing.
 - iv. No on the floor dancing or lap dancing
 - v. No front to front dancing
 - vi. No violent, “mosh pit” style dancing
4. Dance Chaperones will be given the authority to ask students to stop if students are found to be dancing inappropriately.
 - a. No re-entry allowed
5. What is Semi-Formal?
 - a. Boys: Boys should wear a dress suit or dress slacks, dress shirt, a tie, dress shoes and a belt. (A bow tie, turtleneck, or a priest-collar shirt is acceptable). Shirts are to be worn at ALL times. Undergarments may not be visible.
 - b. Girls: Girls are expected to wear a dress or a dressy pants suit. Dresses may be strapless or may feature spaghetti straps. Bare or open backs are acceptable however BARE STOMACHS OR BARE MIDRIFTS ARE NOT PERMITTED. Dress shoes and/or dress sandals are to be worn at all times. Undergarments should not be visible. See-through apparel and outfits with slits 3 inches above the knee are not permitted. Garments that are extremely low-cut are not acceptable.
6. What is NOT Semi-Formal?
 - a. Sweat suits, jumpsuits or jersey dresses are not appropriate for a semi-formal event. No denim. No tattered or torn clothing is allowed. Shoes must be worn the entire evening.
7. All school rules and policies are in force during the entire time of the event and students are expected to
8. Breaking any of these guidelines is cause for immediate removal from dance, both host and guest. Parents will be notified, Dean will be notified, school administrators will be notified and future activities would be jeopardized.
