Students must achieve a grade of **C-** or better in the following areas:

- 1 year of US History
- 1 year of Government and Politics

2 years of the **same World Language** or one of the following:

- C- or better in a third year of a world language
- C- or better of a college level world language for two terms
- Satisfactory performance on an approved assessment of a world language



*****Oregon Public Universities are test optional -- SAT and/or ACT scores are not required.**

Fine Art Requirement for California Public Universities (UC or CSU schools)

- 1 credit of the *same* art course
Example: Art I and Art II *or* a Full year of Band
- Remember 1 semester = 1/2 credit
- New this year is Electronic Music (used to be EMLab) and it WILL count towards the CA art credit!

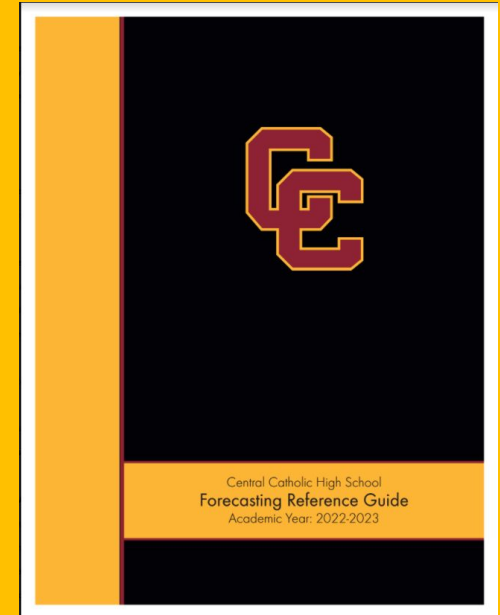

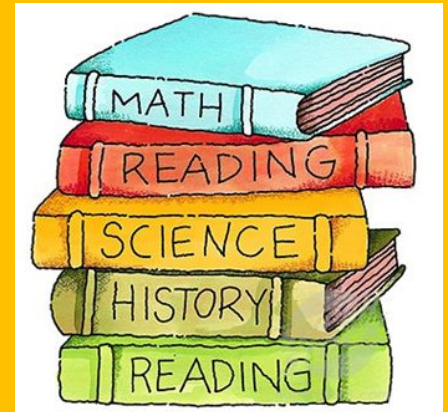

REGARDING AP/HONORS CLASSES

NOTE THE NEW POLICY!

- Students looking to take more than three Honors/AP courses concurrently in one semester must get approval to do so.

Pre-Assigned Placements

Talk to your teacher if unsure of your placement in core classes.



- Moving Honors/AP level → Regular level
(If you are preassigned an honors or AP level course and you want to move to a regular level - this is OK!)



- Moving from Regular Level → Honors/AP level
(If you are preassigned a regular level course and want to move to an Honors this needed to be pre-approved by your current teacher/applications etc.)

- Download/save a copy or take a screenshot of your forecasting worksheet. Please have a parent or guardian review and sign it to confirm they are OK with your selections. Bring the completed and signed form to your counselor.



YOU MUST SUBMIT YOUR CHOICES IN POWER SCHOOL AND TURN YOUR WORKSHEET IN TO YOUR COUNSELOR BY MARCH 15th.

Counselors will be coming into your Theology classes next week to meet with you 1:1 and help answer any questions or concerns.

How to forecast for classes in PowerSchool

1. Power School Logins have been re-set and emailed to parents and students. If you need help with your login information/password - please contact the main office (and ask them very nicely for assistance!!).


2. Portal will be live **Friday, March 3 after school!**

3. Portal will close on **Wednesday, March 15 at 3 PM.** All requests must be submitted by this deadline

4. Use your Forecasting Worksheet to know which courses to select in PowerSchool.

•Step 1: Go to **Central Catholic Website** – click on the **Forecasting Tab** - go to PowerSchool.


