#### **Oregon Public Universities**

Students must achieve a grade of C- or better in the following areas:

- 4 years of **English**
- 3 years of **Mathematics** including Algebra I & Algebra II (or higher)
- 3 years of **Science**
- 3 years of **Social Studies** including:
  - 1 year of World History
  - 1 year of US History
  - 1 year of Government and Politics



- -C- or better in a third year of a world language
- -C- or better of a college level world language for two terms
- -Satisfactory performance on an approved assessment of a world language















\*\*\*Oregon Public Universities are test optional -- SAT and/or ACT scores are not required.

# Fine Art Requirement for California Public Universities (UC or CSU schools)

- <u>1 credit of the same art course</u>

  Example: Art I and Art II or a Full year of Band
- Remember 1 semester = 1/2 credit
- New this year is Electronic Music (used to be EMLab) and it WILL count towards the CA art credit!

   Please have a parent or guardian review and sign it to confirm they are OK with your selections. Bring the completed and signed form to your counselor.



Counselors will be coming into your Theology classes next week to meet with you 1:1 and help answer any questions or concerns.


#### How to forecast for classes in PowerSchool

- 1.Power School Logins have been re-set and emailed to parents and students. If you need help with your login information/password please contact the main office (and ask them very nicely for assistance!!).
- 2.Portal will be live Friday, March 3 after school!
- 3. Portal will close on Wednesday, March 15 at 3 PM. All requests must be submitted by this deadline
- 4. Use your Forecasting Worksheet to know which courses to select in PowerSchool.
- •Step 1: Go to Central Catholic Website click on the Forecasting Tab go to PowerSchool.
- •Step 2: Use your PowerSchool Login to sign in and then create a new password.




Step 2: Click on Class Registration on the left


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# Step 3: Starting with Theology, click the pencil button





### Step 5: Repeat this step for each of the courses
