SUMMER SESSION

Central Catholic High School is pleased to offer a selection of courses for academic credit and enrichment this summer. While classes are available primarily for grades 9-12, some enrichment courses are also available for 7th and 8th grade students. See the attached course catalog for detailed descriptions of each course. GUIDELINES

- Central Catholic High School's summer office hours are Monday Thursday, 7:30am 3:00pm.
- Class sizes are limited. Registration will be accepted in order of date received and must be completed online.
- Minimum enrollment is required for classes to run. All canceled classes will be refunded in their entirety.
- When possible, we will do our best to stick closely to the original class schedule. However, due to teacher availability, exact class times are subject to change.
- In observance of Independence Day, there will be no classes on Monday, July 4th. Classes that week will run Tuesday Friday. Classes that normally run Mondays and Wednesdays will run on Wednesday and Friday that week.
- Scholarships are available! Students may request financial assistance by emailing summersession@centralcatholichigh.org. Scholarships are based on need and are subject to availability. Assistance up to 50% of the overall tuition may be awarded.
- Attendance: Due to the condensed nature of the Summer Session, students must attend all class meetings. Please see specific attendance requirements for academic courses in the course descriptions that follow.
- The PE and Wellness lotteries will close on May 20th. Families will be notified of admittance by May 23rd. Those not admitted to the course(s) will be awarded a full refund for the tuition paid.

CLASSES, TRANSCRIPTS, AND CREDIT

- Central Catholic High School students taking credit retrieval or advancement summer courses will receive an official grade on their transcript. However, that grade will not be included in the student's cumulative GPA.
- Central Catholic High School cannot guarantee that Summer Session credit will be accepted by all other schools. Students are responsible for checking with their school counselor or administrator to determine if Summer Session credits are acceptable. It is the responsibility of students to notify their school of the courses taken and the credit earned.
- Any course needed by a Central Catholic student for credit recovery that is not offered through the Summer Session should be discussed with the student's counselor or the Assistant Principal of Curriculum Design and Instruction.

SUMMER SCHOLARS (Incoming Freshmen ONLY) * *

Central Catholic High School offers the Summer Scholars program for incoming freshmen. The series of three classes gives students the opportunity to get a head start academically and socially as they transition to high school.

Tuition for Full Program (3 Courses): \$350

INTERMEDIATE MATH

A course designed for incoming freshmen who will benefit from solidifying their middle school math skills in order to prepare for high school algebra and beyond.

Tuition for Single Course: \$150

STUDY SKILLS

A course designed for incoming freshmen designed to assist students in learning, understanding, and implementing good study skills and habits. Special emphasis will be placed on helping students maximize the learning process and successfully transition to high school.

INTERMEDIATE LANGUAGE ARTS

A course for incoming freshmen who want to sharpen their reading and writing skills in order to be better prepared for high school English courses.

RAMS Program (RAMS Students and Mentors ONLY)

The primary goal of the RAMS Program is to provide an inclusive Catholic education to high school age students with developmental and intellectual disabilities. These three-day courses are designed to increase independent living skills and help students make positive, active, and healthy choices in their daily routines. Students will learn and practice cooking, budgeting, money math, team building, recreation, and leisure skills with the help of of their peers and peer mentors.*

Tuition: \$150 per session or \$550 for all sessions

* Note: The week of July 4th, classes will run Tuesday through Friday.



Geometry

Designed for students who wish to take a full year of Geometry over the summer, this course will focus on measurement, properties of circles and polygons, the concepts of congruence and similarity, and an introduction to trigonometric ratios. This course provides the students with the opportunity to advance to Algebra II for the next school year. Students are required to complete three years of on-site mathematics to meet graduation requirements.

Grade Level: 9-10

Tuition: \$400 per semester or \$650 for both semesters

Geometry Attendance Policy: Students are not permitted to miss any more than one session per semester and still receive credit for the course.

**Note: Central Catholic students in need of Geometry credit retrieval should be in contact with their counselor prior to signing up for this course.

Introduction to Computer Science

This semester course fulfills the technology graduation requirement beginning with the class of 2020. The course focuses on problem-solving techniques, programming methodologies, software design processes, features of Java programming language, simple data structures, algorithms, and responsible use of computer systems. Students will be able to interpret existing programs, their design, and their development. This course will meet in-person once a week and will include a lunch break. Lunch is not available for purchase on campus.

Physical Education II

This popular course will be filled using a lottery system. It is designed for students who wish to take a semester of PE over the summer. Each student will be provided with an introduction to a variety of activities emphasizing physical fitness, team and individual (lifetime) sports, and recreation. Fundamentals of healthy practices, safety concerns, game rules, skill development, and basic strategies emphasized in each activity. A full refund will be issued for students who sign-up for the course but are not chosen in the lottery process. This class is primarily designed to serve sophomores. Note: Due to a curricular change, all freshmen will take Wellness I and Wellness II in their first year. Therefore, PE I is no longer offered over the summer. Freshmen hoping to advance should take Wellness I and Wellness II over the summer.

Wellness I

This popular course will be filled using a lottery system and is designed for students who wish to take a semester of Wellness over the summer. The content of this course will be drawn from a broad range of topics emphasizing physical, emotional, and mental health. Emphasis will be placed on a wellness approach rooted in Christian values and the following issues may be discussed: body systems, fitness, sexuality, stress management, communicable and non-communicable diseases, mental and emotional health, family and social health, relationships, substance abuse, and decision-making. A full refund will be issued for students who sign-up for the course but are not chosen in the lottery process.

This class is primarily designed to serve freshmen.

Credit Retrieval or Advancement: 0.5

Grade Level: 9-12

Wellness II

This popular course will be filled using a lottery system and is designed for students who wish to take a semester of Wellness over the summer. The content of this course will cover the following subject areas: First Aid and CPR, fitness, nutrition, sleep, anatomy and physiology, substance abuse, disease and prevention, health careers, and addiction. Upon successful completion of practical and written tests, students will be issued first aid and/or CPR certification cards. A full refund will be issued for students who sign-up for the course but are not chosen in the lottery process. This course is designed to serve <u>freshmen and sophomores</u>.

Tuition for Wellness <u>plus</u> PE: \$650

PE/Wellness Attendance Policy: Students are not permitted to miss any more than one session per semester and still receive credit for these courses.



Recovery Theology I - IV

Summer Theology classes aim to build an informed Eucharistic community by pursuing academic rigor and encouraging faith reflection and growth. With a focus on Jesus' mission, Theology courses foster academic sophistication, interfaith awareness, and respect in accordance with Catholic Social Teaching. The Religion Department leads and challenges students in faith-formation through the faculties of both faith and reason. Academic rigor and faith reflection are pursued. With a Christocentric approach, the Religion Department fosters academic sophistication, interfaith awareness and respect in accordance with Catholic values and Magisterial teaching.

Theology courses are taught as a Theology I-IV blend and will be catered to the individual needs of the class.

Note: This course can be used to retrieve Theology credit only, <u>not</u> to advance to another level.



Recovery Spanish I/II

Students learn to negotiate the following social situations: greeting and meeting others, telling time, asking directions, responding to basic questions, requesting food in a restaurant, and giving basic instructions. In addition, students develop listening, reading, and writing competence. A variety of resources are used to introduce students to the geography of Spanish speaking countries and the cultures of Spanish speaking communities. The course develops students' speaking, listening, reading, and writing competence in primarily memorized phrases in highly predictable situations. Students practice following instructions and activities in Spanish. Much of this course is conducted in Spanish.

Spanish II Attendance Policy: Students are not permitted to miss any more than two class sessions and still receive credit for the course.

Recovery English I - III

The Central Catholic High School English curriculum is rooted in the study of literature and composition. Its objectives are to cultivate critical thinking, improve written and oral expression, and develop students' creative, moral, spiritual, and intellectual potential. Dependent upon the size of the class, English will be taught as a I - III blended recovery course. Course material will be catered to students in the class.

College Application Workshop

All rising seniors are encouraged to attend one or more of these four sessions. We will continue the work we started during junior English this spring on the Common Application, an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to more than 900 member colleges and universities in all 50 states. The University of Oregon and Oregon State University are two examples of Common Application schools. Visit commonapp.org/explore-colleges for a complete list of participating institutions. Upon completion of this class, students will have finished the Common Application and will be preparing to request letters of recommendation.

Drawing from Scratch

Have you ever wondered about the drawing process and the technical skills required to produce a convincing drawing utilizing a blank piece of paper and a series of graphite marks? Do you want to impress your family and friends with your artistic and creative abilities? If you've answered YES to any part of these questions, then we invite you to join us for an Intensive Summer Drawing Session -Drawing from Scratch 2022.
