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SUMMER SESSION

Central Catholic High School is pleased to offer a selection of courses for academic credit and enrichment this summer. While classes are available primarily for grades 9-12, some enrichment courses are also available for 7th and 8th grade students. See the attached course catalog for detailed descriptions of each course. GUIDELINES

 Central Catholic High School's summer office hours are Monday – Thursday, 7:30am – 3:00pm.

• Class sizes are limited. Registration will be accepted in order of date received and must be completed online. Minimum enrollment is required for classes to run. All canceled classes will be refunded in their entirety.

• When possible, we will do our best to stick closely to the original class

schedule. However, due to teacher availability, exact class times are subject to change.

• In observance of Independence Day, there will be no classes on Monday or Tuesday, July 3rd and 4th. In an effort not to extend the summer semester, classes will run online and asynchronously the rest of that week.

• Scholarships are available! Students may request financial assistance by emailing summersession@centralcatholichigh.org. Scholarships are based on need and are subject to availability. Assistance <u>up to</u> 50% of the overall tuition for two courses may be awarded.

• Attendance: Due to the condensed nature of the Summer Session, students must attend all class meetings. Please see specific attendance requirements for academic courses in the course descriptions that follow. Extenuating circumstances must be coordinated with instructors.

• The PE and Wellness lotteries will close on May 19th. Families will be notified of admittance by May 22nd. Those not admitted to the course(s) will be awarded a full refund for the tuition paid.

CLASSES, TRANSCRIPTS, AND CREDIT

• Central Catholic High School students taking credit retrieval or advancement summer courses will receive an official grade on their transcript. However, that grade will not be included in the student's cumulative GPA.

• Central Catholic High School cannot guarantee that Summer Session credit will be accepted by all other public and private high schools. Students are responsible for checking with their school counselor or administrator to determine if Summer Session credits are acceptable. It is the responsibility of students to notify their school of the courses taken and the credit earned.

• Any course needed by a Central Catholic student for credit recovery that is not offered through the Summer Session should be discussed with the student's counselor or the Assistant Principal of Curriculum Design and Instruction as soon as possible.

SUMMER SCHOLARS (Incoming Freshmen ONLY) * *

Central Catholic High School offers the Summer Scholars program for incoming Central Catholic freshmen. The set of two classes gives students the opportunity to get a head start academically and socially as they transition to high school.

Monday - Thursday | July 31 - August 17 | 8:00 - 10:50 a.m. Tuition for Full Program (2 Courses): \$300

INTERMEDIATE MATH

A course designed for incoming freshmen who will benefit from solidifying their middle school math skills in order to prepare for high school algebra and beyond. Math study skills will also be a focus. Students will learn and practice effective study techniques.

INTERMEDIATE LANGUAGE ARTS

A course for incoming freshmen who want to sharpen their reading and writing skills in order to be better prepared for high school English courses. English/Language Arts study skills will also be a focus. Students will learn and practice effective study techniques. Monday - Thursday | July 31 - August 17 | 9:30 - 10:50 a.m.

Tuition for Single Course: \$175

Note: Students who are participating in the Summer Scholars Program are also welcome to enroll in one or more of our other Enrichment Courses!

<u>Geometry</u>

Designed for students who wish to take a full year of Geometry over the summer, this course will focus on measurement, properties of circles and polygons, the concepts of congruence and similarity, and an introduction to trigonometric ratios. This course provides the students with the opportunity to advance to Algebra II for the next school year. Students are required to complete three years of on-site mathematics to meet graduation requirements.

Geometry Attendance Policy: Students are not permitted to miss any more than one session per semester and still receive credit for the course.

*Note: In observance of Independence Day, Geometry class will not meet July 3-5. Asynchronous (online) assignments will be required July 6, and in-person classes will resume Monday, July 10.

**Note: Central Catholic students in need of Geometry credit retrieval should be in contact with their counselor <u>prior</u> to signing up for this course.

Introduction to Computer Science

This semester course fulfills the technology graduation requirement beginning with the class of 2020. The course focuses on problem-solving techniques, programming methodologies, software design processes, features of Java programming language, simple data structures, algorithms, and responsible use of computer systems. Students will be able to interpret existing programs, their design, and their development. This course will meet in-person once a week and will include a lunch break. Lunch is not available for purchase on campus.

<u>Physical Education Semester 1</u>

<u>This popular course will be filled using a lottery system</u>. It is designed for students who wish to take a semester of PE over the summer. Each student will be provided with an introduction to a variety of activities emphasizing physical fitness, team and individual (lifetime) sports, and recreation. Fundamentals of healthy practices, safety concerns, game rules, skill development, and basic strategies are emphasized in each activity. A full refund will be issued for students who sign-up for the course but are not chosen in the lottery process.

<u>Physical Education Semester 2</u>

This popular course will be filled using a lottery system. It is designed for students who wish to take a semester of PE over the summer. Each student will be provided with an introduction to a variety of activities emphasizing physical fitness, team and individual (lifetime) sports, and recreation. Fundamentals of healthy practices, safety concerns, game rules, skill development, and basic strategies are emphasized in each activity. A full refund will be issued for students who sign-up for the course but are not chosen in the lottery process.

Wellness I

<u>This popular course will be filled using a lottery system</u> and is designed for students who wish to take a semester of Wellness over the summer. The content of this course will be drawn from a broad range of topics emphasizing physical, emotional, and mental health. Emphasis will be placed on a wellness approach rooted in Christian values and the following issues may be discussed: body systems, fitness, sexuality, stress management, communicable and noncommunicable diseases, mental and emotional health, family and social health, relationships, substance abuse, and decision-making. A full refund will be issued for students who sign-up for the course but are not chosen in the lottery process. This class is primarily designed to serve <u>freshmen</u>.

Grade Level: 9-10 Tuition: \$400 per semester or \$750 for both semesters

*Note: In observance of Independence Day, Wellness class will not meet July 3-5. Class will take place asynchronously online on Thursday, July 6 and resume in-person on Monday, July 10.



<u>Recovery/Advancement Spanish I/II</u>

Students learn to negotiate the following social situations: greeting and meeting others, telling time, asking directions, responding to basic questions, requesting food in a restaurant, and giving basic instructions. In addition, students develop listening, reading, and writing competence. A variety of resources are used to introduce students to the geography of Spanish speaking countries and the cultures of Spanish speaking communities. The course develops students' speaking, listening, reading, and writing competence in primarily memorized phrases in highly predictable situations. Students practice following instructions and activities in Spanish. Much of this course is conducted in Spanish.

<u>Recovery English I - III</u>

The Central Catholic High School English curriculum is rooted in the study of literature and composition. Its objectives are to cultivate critical thinking, improve written and oral expression, and develop students' creative, moral, spiritual, and intellectual potential. Dependent upon the size of the class, English will be taught as a I - III blended recovery course. Course material will be catered to students in the class.

We will start our week by becoming familiar with the way different drawing pencils and techniques affect the work and how to effectively use these art tools, to developing an understanding of value contrast (shading), proportion and perspective while exploring different subjects to draw such as self-portraits and interesting things outdoors. By the end of the week, you will be completing a fully-developed drawing that you'll want to hang on your wall. The First Aid - CPR/AED course incorporates the latest science and teaches students to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies such as burns, cuts, scrapes, sudden illnesses, head, neck, back injuries, heat and cold emergencies and how to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies. <u>Successful students will</u> <u>receive a certificate for Adult First Aid/CPR/AED valid for two years</u>. This one-day course is excellent for those interested in working as a Lifeguard, a Babysitter, a Camp Counselor, and countless other fields!

Red Cross courses now offer Digital Certification, an online version of a Red Cross certificate, which provides anytime, anywhere access to student training history and course certificates. Digital certificates can be viewed, printed or shared online and can be accessed anytime through your Red Cross Account. Each certificate includes a unique ID and a QR code which meets employment requirements and allows employers to easily confirm your certificate is valid. There is no need to carry your printed certificate around anymore!
